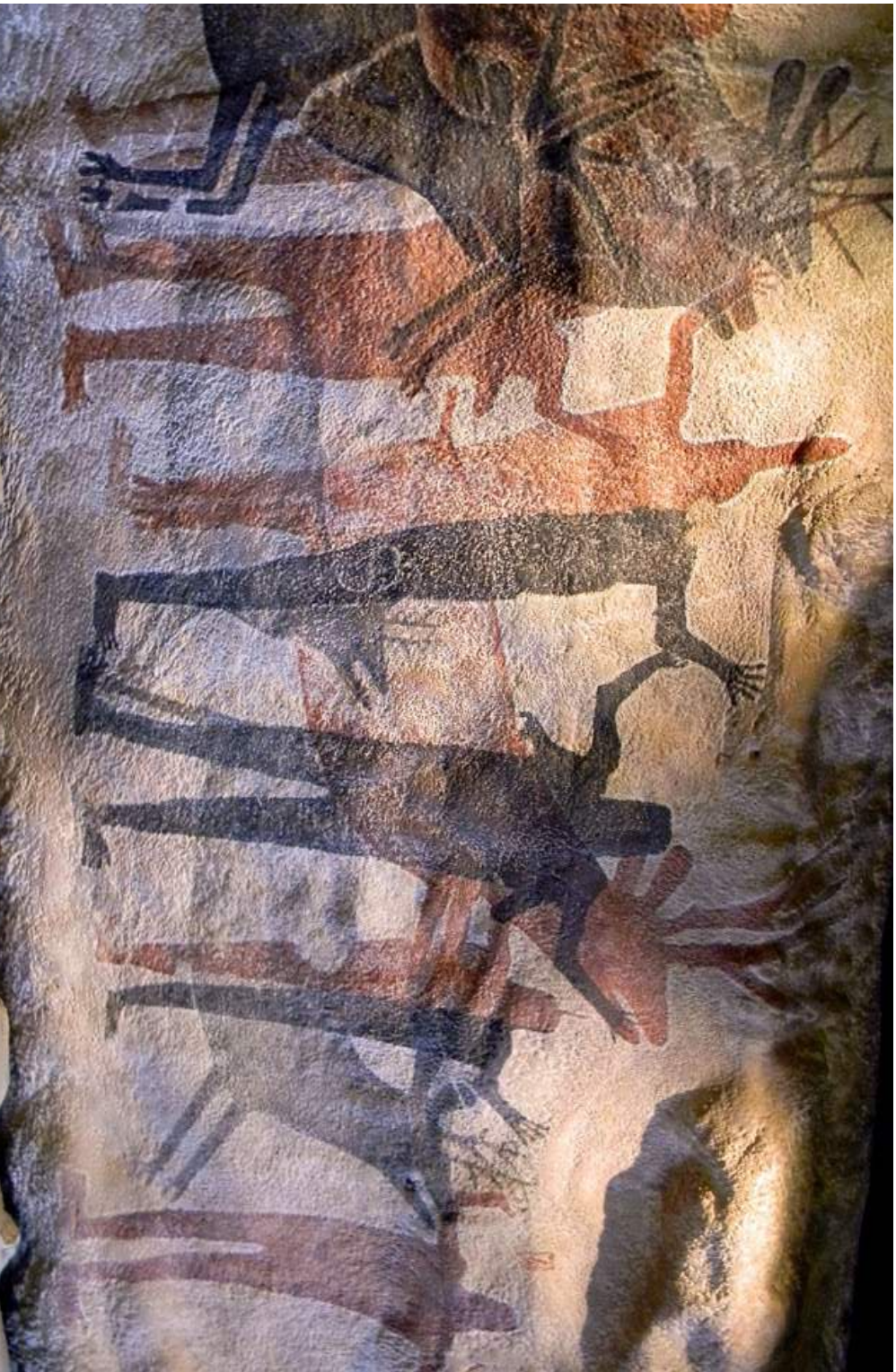


This small village in Spain, Mijas, showcases many traditional Spanish-style homes.
